

Owerko Centre Knowledge Dissemination and Engagement Award Description

Description:

The Owerko Centre Knowledge Dissemination and Engagement Award recognizes individuals or groups who have developed and implemented community-oriented projects that showcase the Owerko Centre's commitment to studying neurodevelopment and/or child mental health in a creative and impactful way.

**Please note, that this award is retrospective and recognizes work that was completed in the previous calendar year. The Owerko Centre Knowledge Dissemination and Engagement Award is forward-looking and is targeted at projects that are in the planning and implementation stages.*

Award value: \$500 each

Eligibility:

- All applicants must have an Owerko Centre investigator as their primary supervisor
- Registered students (Masters, PhD) and Post-Doctoral and Clinical Fellows at the University of Calgary
- Applicant must have been either a full-time post-doctoral /clinical fellowship, or graduate student (MSc and PhD student) in good standing at the time of project
- Applicant must be a current student in good standing at the time of award granting
- Individuals may only be awarded one Knowledge Dissemination and Engagement Award per degree

Application requirements and instructions:

- A completed application form signed by an Owerko Member supervisor
- 1-2 page description of the project and its relevance to neurodevelopment and/or child mental health (single or double spaced, Times Roman 12 pt font and .75 margins)
(Optional – applicants are invited to attach any products related to the research project that may have been developed, e.g. a video, brochure, toolkit, etc)
- 2-page version of the applicant's CV
- Combine all into a single PDF document and send to owerko.centre@ucalgary.ca

Evaluation criteria:

Eligible applications will be reviewed by selected Owerko Center Executive Committee member(s) or member(s). Applications will be adjudicated based on the following criteria:

- Significance and quality of the described public/community activity;
- Clearly demonstrates the applicant's personal involvement in the project;
- Provides evidence of the development or enhancements of networks and partnerships (i.e. K-12 education, high school students, industry partners, public organizations);
- The project has a clear connection to the enhancement of neurodevelopment and/or mental health research for children; and
- Alignment of the described dissemination/engagement activity with the [mission, vision, values, and goals](#) of the Owerko Centre.
