



Owerko Centre Trainee Publication Award Description

Description:

The Owerko Centre Trainee Publication Award recognizes trainees who have first-authored papers focused on neurodevelopment and/or child mental health.

*Please note, that this award is retrospective and recognizes publications that were completed in the previous calendar year.

Award value: \$500

Eligibility:

- o All applicants must have an Owerko Centre investigator as their primary supervisors
- Registered graduate students (Masters, PhD) and Post-Doctoral and Clinical Fellows at the University of Calgary
- Applicant must have, as first author, a paper published in a recognized, peer-reviewed journal during the eligibility period noted above
- Applicant must have been either a full-time post-doctoral scholar, or graduate (MSc and PhD) student in good standing at the time of publication
- o Applicant must be a current student in good standing at time of receiving the award
- o Individuals may only be awarded one Owerko Centre Trainee Publication award per degree

Application requirements and instructions:

- A completed application form signed by Owerko Member supervisor
- One single-page including publication title and description articulating how your article contributed to
 the knowledge base in neurodevelopment and/or mental health in children and it's scientific impact.
 Additionally, did it garner any attention outside academia? For example, did the article receive media
 attention, or receive recognition for its impact, etc. Document to be in Times 12pt font.
- o Attach applicant's published paper
- Combine all into a single PDF document and send to owerko.centre@ucalgary.ca

Evaluation criteria:

Eligible applications will be reviewed by selected Owerko Center Executive Committee member(s) or members. Applications will be adjudicated based on the following criteria:

- o The significance and quality of the publication;
- A demonstration of the publication's contribution and scientific impact on the knowledge base in neurodevelopment and/or mental health in children; and
- The alignment of the topic of the publication with the <u>mission</u>, <u>vision</u>, <u>values</u>, <u>and goals</u> of the Owerko Centre.
