HUMANITARIAN AWARD

Congratulations to **Dr. Nalini Singhal** who received the **2022 Royal College Teasdale-Corti**



Humanitarian Award. The award honours doctors bringing hope and health services to people who lack access to widespread health care.

Dr. Singhal has dedicated her career to giving countless newborns the chance to live longer, healthier lives. With colleagues in the American Academy of Pediatrics, Dr. Singhal helped develop Helping Babies Breathe, an educational program for resuscitating newborns that has been implemented in over 90 countries.

Dr. Singhal has also worked to develop complementary programs, including Essential Care of Every Baby and the Kangaroo Mother Care Program supporting maternal, newborn and childcare around the globe. The success of these programs led the World Health Organization to adapt the programs with Dr. Singhal's involvement. Dr. Singhal "has travelled far and wide, including to many difficult to reach communities, bettering her understanding of barriers faced in different settings to develop new adaptations and ensure 'no newborn is missed,'" says Dr. Jenn Brenner. Dr. Stephen Freedman is a professor of paediatrics and emergency medicine. He is the Alberta Children's Hospital Foundation Professor in Child Health and Wellness and the associate dean, clinical trials at UCalgary. Dr. Freedman's research focuses

on applying clinical research to improve outcomes in children seeking emergency department care. He has dedicated his career to optimizing the care provided with children with acute infectious gastroenteritis and has led national and international studies of COVID in children.

Dr. David Nicholas is the Associate dean, research and partnerships, and professor in the Faculty of Social Work and cross appointed to the Department of Paediatrics, Faculty of Medicine and Dentistry at the University of Alberta. Dr. Nicholas is renowned for work on Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) and neurodevelopmental disability. For 20 years, he has led multiple national and international studies advancing vocational engagement of individuals and quality of life for individuals and families impacted by neurodevelopmental disability and complex health care needs, with a focus on ASD. These include national initiatives that advance engagement of youth and adults with neurodevelopmental disabilities in vocational development and employment. [Read more.](#)

PUBLICATION: COVID-19 VACCINE IN PREGNANCY

A new study led in Alberta by **Dr. Jim Kellner** and **Dr. Otto Vanderkooi** further demonstrates COVID-19 mRNA vaccines are safe during pregnancy. The study, [Safety of COVID-19 vaccines in pregnancy: a Canadian National Vaccine Safety \(CANVAS\) network cohort study](#) published in The Lancet Infectious Diseases, is one of the first to compare vaccine side effects between a vaccinated pregnant group, an unvaccinated pregnant group, and a vaccinated non-pregnant group.

The study used data from the CANVAS-COVID Network, an observational cohort of ~90,000 participants from Ontario, Quebec, BC, Alberta, Nova Scotia, Yukon and PEI. This data can be used in combination with previously published data to provide accurate information to pregnant people receiving COVID-19 vaccines. “The study provides reassuring evidence that COVID-19 mRNA vaccines are safe in pregnancy, with lower rates of significant adverse events following immunisation in pregnant people than non-pregnant vaccine recipients for both mRNA vaccines used in Canada, after dose one and dose two,” says Dr. Kellner.

PUBLICATION: FAMILY PRESENCE IN CANADIAN PICU'S

In the family-centred care models embraced by Canadian Pediatric ICUs, families are seen as core members of the health care team. Two new studies co-led by **Laurie Lee** and team explores family presence in Canadian Pediatric ICU (PICUs).

Published in JBI Evidence Synthesis, [Outcomes associated with family presence at the bedside of critically ill children in the pediatric intensive care unit: a scoping review protocol](#), identified the outcomes of family presence at the bedside of critically ill children in PICUs. Further work, [Family presence in Canadian PICUs during the COVID-19 pandemic: a mixed-methods environmental scan of policy and practice](#), explored family presence policies and practices in Canadian PICUs from March to May 2020, and their evolution by August to December 2020. These publications provide important groundwork for further studies to understand how to best support a child and their family admitted to the PICU.
