INTERNATIONAL INDIGENOUS VOICES IN SOCIAL WORK CONFERENCE

We are excited to share that Elder Dr. Reg Crowshoe, along with Vice-Provost of Indigenous Engagement Dr. Michael Hart, will be attending the <u>7th International Indigenous Voices in Social Work Conference</u> as keynote and plenary speakers. Elder Dr. Rose Crowshoe will be an honorary guest at the conference.

The conference itself is a global gathering dedicated to Indigenous based social work and systemic change. Dr. Reg Crowshoe has had a longstanding relationship with the University of Calgary and was awarded an honorary Doctorate Degree by UCalgary in 2001. Dr. Rose Crowshoe, a mother, grandmother, great grandmother, and wife has been recognized for her efforts to provide safe, ethical, relevant and appropriate cultural teachings in Calgary and surrounding communities for many years. Dr. Michael Hart has focused his life's work on creating ethical space for people and communities to thrive and has worked to enable UCalgary to realize its goals for indigenization on its campuses.
