

# **ACHRI Summer Studentship Support Eligibility Criteria & Application Instructions**

ACHRI Summer Studentships are competitive internal awards for the purpose of providing stipend support to undergraduate students pursuing a summer research position at the University of Calgary, encouraging trainees to explore research as a potential field of study.

**Donor:** ACHRI with funding from the Alberta Children's Hospital Foundation (ACHF)

Field of research: Maternal and child health and wellness

**Value:** \$1,375 per month from ACHRI plus \$500 per month from supervisor

**Number of Awards: 6** 

**Duration:** 8-16 weeks (May-August)

Citizenship: unrestricted

### **Eligibility Criteria**

- Candidates have secured a training position with a supervisor who is a full member of ACHRI<sup>1</sup>
- Candidates research project must be in maternal or child health and wellness.
- Applicants must also meet one of the following criteria:
  - o be registered in a University of Calgary undergraduate degree program or
  - o be registered in an undergraduate degree program outside the University of Calgary, and desiring to engage in research during the summer months at the University of Calgary
- Graduating students may apply for funding but may be given lower priority when funding is limited.
- Must have minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 in current program
- ACHRI summer studentship funding is not available to medical students who have already begun their medical training.
- Only two summer studentship applicants from the same lab / supervisor are allowed to apply in
  one given summer competition, with only one applicant per supervisor being eligible for funding
  each year.

## **Financial Support**

- ACHRI will provide a monthly stipend of \$1,375; supervisors are required to supplement this stipend with a minimum of \$500 per month.
- Health benefits are not provided as part of the award.
- The award may be held for a minimum of 8 weeks and a maximum of 16 weeks during the May through August term.
- The award amount is paid monthly and is prorated based on the student's term.

## **Application Instructions**

- Candidates must submit an application via the UCalgary Summer Student Application portal.
- University of Calgary supervisors are limited to supporting only TWO (2) applications through this consolidated application system.

## **Application Deadline**

- Summer studentship competitions take place in winter.
- Application deadlines are indicated on the <u>Summer Student Application portal page</u> and <u>ACHRI</u> Trainee Funding page.
- Late or incomplete applications will not be accepted.

#### **Evaluation Criteria**

Award eligibility is automatically determined at the time of application, based on the qualifications of the applicant. Applicants will be considered for all awards for which they meet the criteria; however, only ONE (1) offer of award will be made to each successful applicant.

An evaluation rubric can be found in the Evaluation section of the <u>FAQ Page</u> on the Summer Studentship webpage.

The ACHRI Training Review Committee receives a ranked list of applications and will make final award decisions based on:

- quality of the candidate: academic excellence, research experience, awards
- supervisor's research and training environment: publications, grant support, experience in trainee supervision
- significance and quality of the proposed project
- Project is in maternal or child health and wellness

#### **Terms of Award**

- Summer trainees may hold only one award. If the trainee is successful in obtaining a major award or a combination of several awards greater than or equal to the ACHRI Summer Studentship stipend level, the trainee is expected to decline the ACHRI Summer Studentship award.
- ACHRI Summer Studentship awards may only be used for stipend support and not for travel, relocation or other purposes. Health benefits are not provided by ACHRI.
- Students are allowed a maximum of two-weeks vacation during the four-month period, at the discretion of their supervisor(s).
- All awardees are strongly encouraged to deliver a podium or a poster presentation on their summer project at the end of the summer term at the ACHRI Summer Student Symposium.
- Awardees will be required to submit a one-page written report on the project at the end of the summer studentship to achri.training@ucalgary.ca
- Awardees must acknowledge ACHRI in publications, presentations, communications and marketing materials;
- Awardee may be asked to provide biographical sketches to be used for reporting and publicity purposes;
- Supervisors of awardees are expected to participate in the review Committee of ACHRI when asked.
